The Lauderdale County Commission convened at the Lauderdale County Courthouse in the City of Florence, Alabama, at 5:00 p.m. on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of September, 2019. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman of the Lauderdale County Commission, Danny Pettus. Upon roll call, the following members answered present:

Chairman Pettus, upon declaration of a quorum being present, opened the meeting for the transaction of business.

The invocation and Pledge of Allegiance were delivered by Commissioner Hackworth.

Public Comments on Agenda items: None

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner that all items listed on the regular business agenda be approved for immediate consideration. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Agenda is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Garner moved, seconded by Commissioner Hackworth that the minutes of the last regular meeting of the Commission be approved for recording. There being no discussion and upon vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Commissioner Hackworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Parker to approve a resolution that authorizes the change of two regularly scheduled Commission Meetings. The meeting for Monday, October 14<sup>th</sup>, 2019, will be rescheduled for Tuesday, October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2019, due to the Columbus Day Holiday, and the meeting for Monday, November 11<sup>th</sup>, 2019, will be rescheduled for Tuesday, November 12<sup>th</sup>, 2019, due to the Veterans Day Holiday. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein approved and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Garner moved, seconded by Commissioner Holmes to approve a resolution to authorize a Budget Amendment for the Reappraisal Department for fiscal year 2018-2019 by line item only. Overages occurring in Training/Educational, Office Supplies and Noncapital

Assets shall be reconciled by excess funds in Legal Services and Health Insurance. The total amendment is seven thousand two hundred dollars. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution and Budget Revision Request is herein approved and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Parker moved, seconded by Commissioner Holmes to approve a resolution to authorize a Budget Amendment for the Lauderdale County Road Department for fiscal year 2018-2019. Amendment is due to the previously approved purchase of a 2020 Mack Truck Lowboy Tractor at a cost of two hundred two thousand four hundred sixty-five dollars. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner to approve a resolution to accept the Lauderdale County Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 in the amount of thirty-five million one hundred thirty-two thousand fifty-five dollars. The payroll updates for the 2019-2020 budget will begin October 6<sup>th</sup>, 2019. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution and budget documentation is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner to approve a resolution to authorize a new pay scale for Lauderdale County Sheriff's Deputies and Jail Correctional Deputies as of October 6<sup>th</sup>, 2019. The new pay scale provides a more current and competitive pay scale and will be separate from the Lauderdale County Commission payroll program. Each department will have their own pay scale based on several criteria. All Lauderdale County Support Staff for the Sheriff's Department and for the Jail will remain on the Lauderdale County current pay policy. All other Lauderdale County Commission Policies and Personnel Procedures will continue to apply to all Lauderdale County employees, including Sheriff Deputies and Jail Correctional Deputies. All payroll issues concerning raises and cost of living increases will be separate and will not be combined. The Lauderdale County Commission may, at their discretion, discontinue or modify any pay program for Lauderdale County. Commissioner Parker confirmed with Lauderdale County Sheriff, Rick Singleton, that he approved of the Resolution as written. Mr. Singleton indicated that he does approve. There being no further discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution and pay scale documentation are herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Garner moved, seconded by Commissioner Hackworth to approve a resolution to allow the County Commission to honor the special pricing discount of 34.1% from Printers and Stationers from our original bid for General Office Supplies for one additional year using the 2019-2020 office Supply Catalog. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Hackworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Holmes to approve a resolution to pay the 2020 Alabama Worker's Compensation Self-Insurers Fund in the amount of four hundred forty-two thousand three hundred thirty-seven dollars and forty-two cents. This participation is with the Association of County Commissions of Alabama and will be paid after October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner to approve a resolution to authorize an agreement with Tennessee Valley Authority for Radiological Emergency Preparedness Funding. This agreement has been developed to detail the responsibilities and obligations of both parties in the partnership. The agreement will be maintained with the Lauderdale County EMA Department. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion

unanimously approved. Resolution and agreement is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

In compliance with bid laws of the State of Alabama, sealed bids were advertised for Bid No. 2020-1 "Crushed Stone". Bids were received and publicly read aloud on September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019. Chairman Pettus asked Road Department Assistant Engineer, David Abernathy, for his recommendation. Mr. Abernathy stated that the lowest of three bidders was Rogers Group. Commissioner Parker moved to accept the bid and Commissioner Hackworth seconded. There being no further discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Bid is awarded to Rogers Group of Tuscumbia, Alabama. Bid tabulation sheet is recorded and made part of these minutes

In compliance with bid laws of the State of Alabama, sealed bids were advertised for Bid No. 2020-2 "Polypropylene Pipe". Bids were received and publicly read aloud on September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019. Chairman Pettus asked Road Department Assistant Engineer, David Abernathy, for his recommendation. Mr. Abernathy stated that the only bid received was from ADCO Pipe & Supply, LLC. Commissioner Parker moved to accept the bid and Commissioner Holmes seconded. There being no further discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Bid is awarded to ADCO Pipe & Supply, LLC, of Florence, Alabama. Bid tabulation sheet is recorded and made part of these minutes

The invoiced bills were audited, allowed, and ordered to be paid upon a motion by Commissioner Parker and seconded by Commissioner Hackworth. Commissioner Parker asked Lauderdale County Road Department Engineer, David Abernathy, to elaborate on the Road Department expenses within the Account Payable Fund total. Mr. Abernathy confirmed there were several expenditures including equipment as well as paving and striping jobs. There being no further discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Jimmy Glass, Town of Anderson Mayor



RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Lauderdale County Sheriff, Rick Singleton, has requested the Lauderdale County Commission review the current pay rate for all Lauderdale County Sheriff Deputies and Lauderdale County Jail Correctional Deputies in order to provide more current and competitive pay rates; and

WHEREAS, the Lauderdale County Commission has proposed a pay scale for all Lauderdale County Sheriff Deputies. The proposed pay scale will have three classifications which are DS1, DS2 and DS3. Each classification is determined by training, years in law enforcement and education along with annual satisfactory job performance. The proposed pay scale is an eleven-step program with a twenty year top out rate. All Lauderdale County Sheriff Deputies, on October 6<sup>th</sup>, 2019, will be placed on the proposed pay scale according to the classification requirements met. The minimum starting annual rate for a newly hired Sheriff Deputy is thirty-four thousand seven hundred twenty-five dollars; and

WHEREAS, the Lauderdale County Commission has proposed a pay scale for all Lauderdale County Jail Correctional Deputies. The proposed pay scale is an eleven-step program with a twenty year top out rate. All Lauderdale County Jail Correctional Deputies, on October 6<sup>th</sup>, 2019, will be placed on the proposed pay scale according to years of service. The starting annual rate for a newly hired Jail Correctional Deputy is thirty thousand dollars; and

WHEREAS, the Lauderdale County Sheriff Deputies and the Lauderdale County Jail Correctional Deputies proposed pay scales will no longer be connected with the Lauderdale County Commission payroll program. Any changes to classifications or pay rates may only occur at budget time each year on October 1<sup>st</sup>. All other Lauderdale County Commission policies and personnel procedures will continue to apply to all Lauderdale County employees, including Sheriff Deputies and Jail Correctional Deputies; and

WHEREAS, all administrative support staff for the Sheriff's Department and the Jail will remain part of the Lauderdale County Commission payroll program and the Lauderdale County Commission will remain in full control of all decisions associated with the proposed pay scale for Lauderdale County Sheriff Deputies, Jail Correctional Deputies and all Lauderdale County Departments and may modify or discontinue any program at its discretion.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Lauderdale County Commission approves the proposed pay scales for the Lauderdale County Sheriff Deputies and Jail Correctional Deputies as described above and included herein with charts attached to this resolution.
