The Lauderdale County Commission convened at the Lauderdale County Courthouse in the City of Florence, Alabama, at 5:00 p.m. on the 27th day of January, 2020. Chairman Pettus, upon declaration of a quorum being present, opened the meeting for the transaction of business.

The invocation and Pledge of Allegiance were delivered by Commissioner Holmes.

Public Comments on Agenda items: None

Commissioner Parker moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner that all items listed on the regular business agenda be approved for immediate consideration. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Agenda is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Hackworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Holmes that the minutes of the last regular meeting of the Commission be approved for recording. There being no discussion and upon vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Commissioner Parker moved, seconded by Commissioner Hackworth to approve a resolution to show support for Lauderdale County Probate Judge, Will Motlow, to submit a Helping America Vote Act (HAVA) County Remuneration Application to the State of Alabama. These funds would be used to help improve the parking lot lighting at the Zip City Community Center at a cost of five thousand eight hundred thirty dollars and forty cents. Commissioner Parker commended Judge Motlow for his work toward this well needed improvement at this voting poll and for his concern for the safety of voters. There being no further discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner to approve a resolution to authorize a Budget Revision Request. The amendment is by line item only for overages in Worker's Compensation reconciled by excess funds in Salaries in the amount of five thousand four hundred ninety-one dollars. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution and Budget Revision Request Form are herein approved and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Garner moved, seconded by Commissioner Parker to approve a resolution to renew its participation in the Liability Self-Insurance Fund, Inc., through the Association of County Commission of Alabama (ACCA) for calendar years 2021 through 2023. representation and service continues to be in the best interest of Lauderdale County, its officials and employees. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Commissioner Parker moved, seconded by Commissioner Holmes to approve a resolution to authorize an update to the Flood Damage Prevention Resolution of July 9th, 2018. The Commission renews it participation in this program in efforts to minimize public and private losses due to flood conditions in specific areas by provision listed in the Flood Damage Prevention Resolution and authorizes Lauderdale County Floodplain Manager, Eric Hill to continue to administer this program. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein approved and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Hackworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner to approve out-ofstate travel that Lauderdale County EMA Director, George Grabryan, has requested for himself and one of his employees. Mr. Grabryan and Ryan Welty will attend the Auxiliary Communication Class in Burlington, North Carolina, from February 13th through February 16th, 2020. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Parker to approve out-of-state travel that Lauderdale County Road Department Engineer, Eric Hill, has requested for himself. Mr. Hill will take a day trip some time before February 28th, 2020, to travel to Murfreesboro, Tennessee, to examine a certain kind of road block in the area that could possibly help Lauderdale County during severe rains such as those recently experienced in the County. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

The invoiced bills were audited, allowed, and ordered to be paid upon a motion by Commissioner Parker and seconded by Commissioner Hackworth. Commissioner Holmes stated that Solid Waste expenditures were due to two large items including thirty-five thousand for new garbage carts and forty-three thousand for annual service of a wood grinder. Commissioner Hackworth asked Solid Waste Manager, Tom Smith, if lights had been installed in the service area and Mr. Smith confirmed they had and further stated there are also plans for more to be installed at the Landfill. There being no further discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved.
