The Lauderdale County Commission convened at the Lauderdale County Courthouse in the City of Florence, Alabama, at 5:00 p.m. on the 10th day of August, 2020. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman of the Lauderdale County Commission, Danny Pettus. Upon roll call the following members answered present:

Chairman Danny Pettus, upon declaration of a quorum being present, opened the meeting for the transaction of business.

The invocation and Pledge of Allegiance were delivered by Chairman Pettus.

Public Comments on Agenda Items: None

Commissioner Garner moved, seconded by Commissioner Holmes that all items listed on the regular business agenda be approved for immediate consideration. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Agenda is herein recorded and made a part of these minutes.

Commissioner Hackworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner that the minutes of the last regular meeting of the Commission be approved for recording. There being no discussion and upon vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Hackworth to approve a resolution that authorizes the Lauderdale County Commission to upgrade existing computer equipment to limit down-time in the event of a server error and adding virtual servers to help protect the system network and firewall protection. This upgrade will cost thirty-six thousand three hundred fifty-six dollars and sixty-eight cents and any budget amendment necessary is herein approved. Commissioner Holmes stated that this project would be funding with COVID-19 funds available and would also provide the capability of working remotely in the event of a government shutdown. There being no further discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Hackworth to authorize a resolution to authorize damaged/non-working vehicles and equipment to be removed from

inventory and sold by bid process online at govdeals.com. The merchandise will be sold by bidding online process. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution and inventory listing are herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner to authorize a resolution to allow the Lauderdale County Commission to renew a contract for one year with Southern Health Partners for medical services provided to the jail. The monthly cost will be increase by three percent for a total of forty thousand four hundred twenty-nine dollars and ten cents per month with an annual cost pool limit of eighty-four thousand dollars. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion is unanimously approved. Resolution and agreement are herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Hackworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Holmes to authorize a resolution to approve changes to the upcoming Commission Meeting schedules during September and October. The work session scheduled for Monday, September 7th will be rescheduled for Tuesday, September 8th, at 5pm, due to the Labor Day Holiday. The meeting scheduled for Monday, October 12th will be rescheduled for Tuesday, October 13th, at 5pm, due to the Columbus Day Holiday. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner to authorize a resolution to show how gas tax revenue will be expended under the 2021 Rebuild Alabama Transportation Plan. The funds will be used for resurfacing and striping on various portions of several county roads. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion is unanimously approved. Resolution and transportation plan map are herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Hackworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Holmes to authorize a resolution to allow the Lauderdale County Commission and the Lauderdale County Board of Education to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding regarding a proposed allocation of the Simplified Sellers and Use Tax (SSUT). There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution, Memorandum of Understanding and like Resolution from the Lauderdale County Board of Education are herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Garner moved, seconded by Commissioner Hackworth to authorize a resolution to allow the Lauderdale County Emergency Management Agency to enter into a contract with Josh Briggs to provide an exercise for emergency responders with an emphasis on risks associated with cyber security. The cost of the exercise is six thousand five hundred dollars and will be paid from 9LOC-EMA Grant funds. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution and contract are herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

In compliance with bid laws of the State of Alabama, sealed bids were advertised for Bid No. 2020-1 "Various Print Bids". Bids were received and publicly read aloud on July August 7th, 2020. Chairman Pettus asked Lauderdale County Administrator, Brenda Bryant, for her recommendation. Ms. Bryant stated that bids for five items were received from two companies, Printers & Stationers and Herald Printing, both of Florence, Alabama. Ms. Bryant recommends we go with the lowest bidder for each item with no price breaks for higher quantities quoted. Printers & Stationers had the lowest price for five thousand Revenue Printed Envelopes at a cost of two hundred nineteen dollars. Herald Printing has the lowest price for the remaining items: one thousand EMA Business Cards for John Rochester and Ryan Welty at a cost of forty-six dollars and seventy-five cents, two thousand EMA Letterhead at a cost of one hundred seventy-five dollars, and twenty-five hundred County Commission Window Envelopes at a cost of one hundred twenty-four dollars and fifty cents. Commissioner Garner moved, seconded by Commissioner

Holmes, to follow Ms. Bryant's recommendation. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Bids are awarded to Printers & Stationers and Herald Printing, both of Florence, Alabama. Bid tabulation sheet is recorded and made part of these minutes.

All invoiced bills were audited, allowed and ordered to be paid upon a motion made by Commissioner Holmes and seconded by Commissioner Hackworth. Commissioner Holmes asked County Engineer, Eric Hill, if sixty-six thousand six hundred fifty-nine dollars and two cents of listed road expense was for the continued work being done to replace the bridge over County Road 16. Mr. Hill confirmed this allocation. Commissioner Hackworth asked County Engineer, Eric Hill, if some of the road expense was also due to striping of County roads to which Mr. Hill said it was. There being no further discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved.


Public Comment Period:

WHEREAS, the Lauderdale County Road Department requests these funds be used for resurfacing and installing traffic striping on various portions of several county roads.



WHEREAS the Memorandum of Understanding must be signed by the Lauderdale County Commission Chairman and the Lauderdale County Board of Education Superintendent.


