The Lauderdale County Commission convened at the Lauderdale County Courthouse in the City of Florence, Alabama, at 5:00 p.m. on the 27th day of September, 2021. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman of the Lauderdale County Commission, Danny Pettus. Upon roll call the following members answered present:

Chairman Danny Pettus, upon declaration of a quorum being present, opened the meeting for the transaction of business.

The invocation and Pledge of Allegiance were delivered by Chairman Pettus.

Awards and Presentations: None

Public Comments on Agenda Items: None

Commissioner Parker moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner that all items listed on the regular business agenda be approved for immediate consideration. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Agenda is herein recorded and made a part of these minutes.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner that the minutes of the last regular meeting of the Commission be approved for recording. There being no discussion and upon vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Commissioner Hackworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Parker to approve a resolution to authorize the Commission to enter into a partnership with Alabama State University regarding digital mapping software for the Board of Registrar's. This software will assist with redistricting and demographic updates made to voting districts within Lauderdale County. The cost for this service should not exceed two thousand five hundred dollars and any budget amendment needed is approved. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Garner moved, seconded by Commissioner Holmes to approve a resolution to authorize the renewal of the Commission's website contract for fiscal year 2022. The Website Service Contract is with Digital Boutique Co., formerly Biz Marketing Agency. The annual retention fee is one thousand dollars and any budget amendment for this renewal is approved. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Parker moved, seconded by Commissioner Hackworth to approve a resolution to authorize the renewal of Printers and Stationers, Inc. (PSI) for office supplies for fiscal year 2022. The Commission has received written notice from PSI that they will continue to honor the current catalog pricing discount of 34.1% for General Office Supplies for fiscal year 2022. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Parker to approve a resolution to authorize a Budget Revision Request from Reappraisal. The Reappraisal Department has submitted a request for fiscal year 2021. Shortages in Office Supplies, Unemployment Insurance, Other Compensation and Management Consulting Services will be reconciled by excess funds in Contracted Services. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion approved. Resolution is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner to reappoint Beverly Absher-Bone to the NACOLG Non-Elected Board of Directors with term effective immediately and expiring September 30th, 2022. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Commissioner Hackworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Parker to reappoint John Allgood to the NACOLG Non-Elected Board of Directors with term effective immediately and expiring September 30th, 2022. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Commissioner Parker moved, seconded by Commissioner Hackworth to reappoint Chip Kasmeier to the NACOLG Non-Elected Board of Directors with term effective immediately and expiring September 30th, 2022. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Commissioner Parker moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner to approve an FMLA request by Judge Motlow for one of his Probate employees. Leave will begin September 24th, 2021, with anticipated return date of November 19th, 2021. All paperwork is in order for this leave. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

In compliance with bid laws of the State of Alabama, sealed bids were advertised for Bid LA 2022-2 "Handicap Voter Access for O.C. Eppes Community Center". Bids were received and publicly read aloud on September 21st, 2021. Chairman Pettus asked County Administrator, Brenda Bryant, for her recommendation. Ms. Bryant stated that we only received one bid from a contractor and the price was high at forty-five thousand four hundred dollars. Commissioner Holmes motioned, seconded by Commissioner Parker to award the bid. A discussion was held regarding the lack of bidders and the unexpected expense of the bid received. Commissioner Holmes withdrew his motion. Commissioner Hackworth motioned, seconded by Commissioner Parker to table the bid until some research can be done to decide whether this is our only option before we award this bid or re-bid the project. There being no further discussion and upon a vote taken, motion tabled. Bid will not be awarded at this time.

In compliance with bid laws of the State of Alabama, sealed bids were advertised for Bid LA 2021-10 "Improvements at Brush Creek Park". Bids were received and publicly read aloud on September 23rd, 2021. Chairman Pettus asked County Administrator, Brenda Bryant, for her recommendation. She referred to Tom Smith and Eric Hill who were present at the mandatory pre-bid meeting with all prospective bidders. Two bidders were at the pre-bid meeting and both bid on the project. Rogers Group bid at a total cost of five hundred forty-five thousand dollars and Pierce & Allred bid a total cost of one hundred eighty-four thousand eight hundred forty-nine dollars. Tom Smith stated that there was some adjustment to the total area being paved as a certain portion of one road stays underwater and that portion will not be paved. Both bidders bid accordingly. Commissioner Hackworth asked about Pierce & Allred since we had a negative experience with them in the past even though they were the lowest bidder for this project. Eric

Hill stated that Pierce & Allred had recently acquired a reputable company in which he had much confidence in their performance. Mr. Hill further stated that he felt the large price difference between bidders showed the higher bidder wasn't very interested in the job. Chairman Pettus asked Mr. Hill if daily oversight of the construction would occur and Mr. Hill assured him it would. Commissioner Parker motioned, seconded by Commissioner Hackworth to award the bid to Pierce & Allred. There being no further discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Bid is awarded to Pierce & Allred of Florence, Alabama. Bid tabulation sheet is recorded and made part of these minutes.

In compliance with bid laws of the State of Alabama, sealed bids were advertised for Bid 2022-1 "Lubricants". Bids were received and publicly read aloud on September 23rd, 2021. Chairman Pettus asked County Road Department Engineer, Eric Hill, for his recommendation. Mr. Hill recommended we award the bid to the only bidder, W.H. Thomas Oil. Commissioner Holmes motioned, seconded by Commissioner Garner to award the bid as recommended. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Bid is awarded to W.H. Thomas Oil of Decatur, Alabama. Bid tabulation sheet is recorded and made part of these minutes.

In compliance with bid laws of the State of Alabama, sealed bids were advertised for Bid 2022-2 "Polypropylene Pipe". Bids were received and publicly read aloud on September 23rd, 2021. Chairman Pettus asked County Road Department Engineer, Eric Hill, for his recommendation. Mr. Hill recommended we award the bid to the only bidder, ADCO Pipe & Supply. Commissioner Hackworth motioned, seconded by Commissioner Garner to award the bid as recommended. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Bid is awarded to ADCO Pipe & Supply, LLC, of Florence, Alabama. Bid tabulation sheet is recorded and made part of these minutes.

In compliance with bid laws of the State of Alabama, sealed bids were advertised for Bid 2022-3 "Corrugated HDPE Pipe". Bids were received and publicly read aloud on September 23rd, 2021. Chairman Pettus asked County Road Department Engineer, Eric Hill, for his recommendation. Mr. Hill recommended we award the bid to the only bidder, ADCO Pipe & Supply. Commissioner Parker motioned, seconded by Commissioner Hackworth to award the bid as recommended. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Bid is awarded to ADCO Pipe & Supply of Florence, Alabama. Bid tabulation sheet is recorded and made part of these minutes.

In compliance with bid laws of the State of Alabama, sealed bids were advertised for Bid 2022-4 "Traffic Signs & Reflectors". Bids were received and publicly read aloud on September 23rd, 2021. Chairman Pettus asked County Road Department Engineer, Eric Hill, for his recommendation. Mr. Hill stated that we received bids from two companies – Vulcan Signs and Traffic Signs, Inc. – and he recommended the lowest bidder, Vulcan Signs. Commissioner Parker motioned, seconded by Commissioner Holmes to award the bid as recommended. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Bid is awarded to Vulcan Signs & Stamping, Inc. of Foley, Alabama. Bid tabulation sheet is recorded and made part of these minutes.

In compliance with bid laws of the State of Alabama, sealed bids were advertised for Bid 2022-5 "Resurfacing Various Lauderdale County Roads". Bids were received and publicly read aloud on September 23rd, 2021. Chairman Pettus asked County Road Department Engineer, Eric Hill, for his recommendation. Mr. Hill stated that we received bids from two companies – Midsouth Paving and Rogers Group – and he recommended the lowest bidder, Midsouth Paving. Commissioner Garner motioned, seconded by Commissioner Holmes to award the bid as recommended. Commissioner Parker asked about the availability of Midsouth to complete the job requested since they had not completed work previously requested by the county. Mr. Hill stated that this is a known problem in our current job climate with a lack of workers to perform all that is needed no matter which company is awarded the bid. Upon a vote taken to award the bid, the Commissioners voted as follows:

There being no further discussion, motion approved. Bid is awarded to Midsouth Paving, Inc. of Tuscumbia, Alabama. Bid tabulation sheet is recorded and made part of these minutes.

In compliance with bid laws of the State of Alabama, sealed bids were advertised for Bid 2022-6 “Striping Various Lauderdale County Roads”. Bids were received and publicly read aloud on September 23rd, 2021. Chairman Pettus asked County Road Department Engineer, Eric Hill, for his recommendation. Mr. Hill stated that we received bids from two companies – Ozark Striping and Riverside Traffic System – and he recommended the lowest bidder, Ozark Striping. Commissioner Hackworth motioned, seconded by Commissioner Garner to award the bid as recommended. A discussion was held regarding the fact that Ozark has been unable to complete previous jobs for the county and Mr. Hill stated that Ozark worked for most Alabama counties, but the demand is so great and the vendors so few that they are the only option at this time. Commissioner Parker asked Mr. Hill about the county doing their own striping with their own equipment and employees. A discussion was held regarding the many factors to consider if the county were to do their own striping. Mr. Hill stated that he would look further into what all that would entail and report back to the Commission. Upon a vote taken to award the bid, the Commissioners voted as follows:

Commissioner Holmes – aye
Commissioner Parker – nay

There being no further discussion, motion approved. Bid is awarded Ozark Striping Co., Inc. of Ozark, Alabama. Bid tabulation sheet is recorded and made part of these minutes.

In compliance with bid laws of the State of Alabama, sealed bids were advertised for Bid 2022-7 “Hot Mix Asphalt (Pick-up at Plant)”. Bids were received and publicly read aloud on September 23rd, 2021. Chairman Pettus asked County Road Department Engineer, Eric Hill, for his recommendation. Mr. Hill stated that we received bids from two companies – Midsouth Paving and Rogers Group – and he recommends we go with the lowest bidder, Midsouth Paving. Mr. Hill further stated that Rogers Group would supply the product at their bid price should Midsouth be unable to provide for any reason. Commissioner Holmes motioned, seconded by Commissioner Garner to award the bid as recommended. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Bid is awarded to Midsouth Paving, Inc. of Tuscumbia, Alabama. Bid tabulation sheet is recorded and made part of these minutes.

All invoiced bills were audited, allowed and ordered to be paid upon by a motion made by Commissioner Parker seconded by Commissioner Holmes. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Staff Reports:

Lauderdale County Road Department Engineer, Eric Hill, reported on his investigation into the County Road near Rock Church and the remedy to the standing water issue occurring on the roadway. Mr. Hill stated that a long-term solution would involve a grid material to fill and raise the existing road and finish with paving. A discussion was held about the details of this solution and a recommendation of having a designer to inspect the road once complete. Mr. Hill stated that he could have all details back to the Commission by the end of October and could possibly start the project as early as Spring 2022.


Public Comment Period:

Several members of the Rock Church community were present. Latoyia Jones, Nathaniel Simpson and Henry Simpson had clarifying questions and further recommendations regarding Mr. Hill's solution for the road. Commissioner Holmes stated that the county can repair the roadway and the church would need to be prepared for any work that may be necessary on their property at their own expense in order to accommodate the raised roadway adjoining their parking lot.

Commissioner Parker stated that he wanted to clarify his opposition to awarding the bids for the striping and paving of county roads.

There being no further business to come before the Commission and upon a motion made by Commissioner Garner and seconded by Commissioner Holmes, the meeting was duly adjourned until the next regular meeting subject to call.

Digital Boutique Co. Website Service Contract

This contract is a legally binding agreement between ___Lauderdale County
Commission_____ and Digital Boutique Co., entered into on __10/1/2021_____.

Agreement

- Whereas Digital Boutique Co. will be available as the website manager for the client. -
Whereas the Client will compensate Digital Boutique Co. for said services by paying a fee
(See Sec. 3) due on __10/1/2021_____.

Terms 1. Duration

- Digital Boutique Co. will render services to the Client for an initial period of 1 year
beginning on __10/1/2021_____.
- Digital Boutique Co. will work to establish what techniques will work best for the
organization as well.
- Should the Client choose to terminate the contract, they are to give an initial thirty (7) day
notice, the Client must present Digital Boutique Co. with a written notice of termination

2. Services

- Digital Boutique Co. will establish the organization's presence by doing the following
services selected by the client. -Annual management fee is ___\$1,000_____. Digital Boutique
Co. will bill the client upon completion of periodically requested tasks for \$60 Hourly
maintenance fee with a one hour minimum.

3. Compensation- Digital Boutique Co. accept payment through Freshbooks or by Check.

- In the event that the Client fails to pay the Digital Boutique Co. according to the payment
schedule in Freshbooks, Digital Boutique Co. will cease to provide services until payment is
received. -Once payment for the period has been made in full, Digital Boutique Co. will
resume provision

of services. Should a suspension of services occur, the complete payment will be necessary to resume services – a prorated amount will not be provided

4. Account Access & Authorization -Digital Boutique Co. is authorized by the Client to assume the identity of the Client in all social media interactions on the internet including, but not limited to, status updates, blog posts, online forum discussions and message board posts, comments, and responses to user comments, and emails. - Digital Boutique Co. will hold the Client's URLs, usernames, and passwords in confidence. Digital Boutique Co. will not share this information under any circumstances, nor will the Consultant sell this information to a third (3rd) party.

5. Rights to Created Content - The Client will retain the right to all content created by Digital Boutique Co. for the Client, while under contract, ad infinitum. However, the Client may not distribute for profit any content created by Digital Boutique Co. for the Client, while under contract, without the written consent of Digital Boutique Co..

- Furthermore, Digital Boutique Co. will retain the right to use any and all content created by Digital Boutique Co. for the Client, while under contract, for the purpose of (1) providing samples of Digital Boutique Co. work or (2) instruction – including, but not limited to, presentations, lectures, webinars, and published material in any medium.

6. Access to Client Information - From time to time, Digital Boutique Co. may need to keep client information on file due to the nature of uploading content to the website. This information will be stored in an electronic folder and deleted upon completion of the task.

- Digital Boutique Co. will not share this information under any circumstances, nor will Digital Boutique Co. sell this information to a third (3rd) party.

7. Liability Waiver - Establishing a social media presence and initiating a two-way flow of communication between the Client and the public can have unintended consequences on the Client's reputation. Should this occur, the Client waives its right to Digital Boutique Co. responsible for any damage and/or liability that may arise from Digital Boutique Co. actions on behalf of the Client. - If, at any time, the Client does not agree with actions taken by Digital Boutique Co. in its behalf, it must notify Digital Boutique Co. in writing. If Digital Boutique Co. receives such a communication, Digital Boutique Co. will post a retraction and apology across all affected platforms within twenty-four (24) hours.

8. Service Interruption - Either party shall be excused from any delay or failure in performance required hereunder if caused by reason of any occurrence or contingency beyond its reasonable control, including, but not limited to, acts of God, acts of war, fire, laws, proclamations, edits, ordinances or regulations, riots, earthquakes, floods, explosions or other acts of nature. The obligations and rights of the party so excused shall be extended on a day-to-day basis for the

time period equal to the period of such excusable interruption. When such events have abated, the parties' respective obligations hereunder shall resume. In the event the interruption of the excused party's obligations continues for a period in excess of thirty (30) days, either party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon ten days' prior written notice to the other party.
Amendments & Addendum

- This contract is to be considered complete and final. However, the field of social media is rapidly changing and said changes may necessitate amendment or addition to this contract. Should such a need arise, the amendment or addendum must be drawn up as a separate document, signed by both parties indicating their agreement, and a copy of the signed document must be provided to the Client and, Digital Boutique Co..

Entire Agreement - Should either party violate the terms of or fail to meet the obligations set forth in this contract, such action will render the opposing party free from any further contractual obligation. IN WITNESS WHEREOF, both parties signify their authority to act on their organization's behalf and agreement to abide by the terms of this contract effective the date written above by the signatures affixed below.
