Chairman Danny Pettus, upon declaration of a quorum being present, opened the meeting for the transaction of business.

The invocation and Pledge of Allegiance were delivered by Commissioner Parker.

Commissioner Hackworth moved, seconded by Commissioner Parker that all items listed on the regular business agenda be approved for immediate consideration. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Agenda is herein recorded and made a part of these minutes.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner that the minutes of the last regular meeting of the Commission be approved for recording. There being no discussion and upon vote taken, motion unanimously approved.

Commissioner Garner moved, seconded by Commissioner Holmes to approve a resolution to authorize a contract extension with Shoals Ambulance. Bid LA 2019-6 "Advanced Life Support Emergency Medical Treatment and Transportation Service" was awarded to Shoals Ambulance and expires March 28th, 2022. A new bid for this service, Bid LA 2022-10, has an opening date of April 18th, 2022. Shoals Ambulance has agreed to extend the current contract for ninety days in order to allow time for the new bid to be awarded and implemented. The Advanced Life Support Emergency Medical Treatment and Transportation Service is a joint contract with the City of Florence and the Commission will seek the continued support of the City of Florence regarding this service. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Parker moved, seconded by Commissioner Garner to approve a resolution to authorize renewal of Bid LA 2020-7 "Cleaning Products Requiring Dispensers" awarded to Ecolab of St. Paul, Minnesota in May 2020. By written confirmation, Ecolab has agreed to continue the pricing provided in the original bid for a third term effective May 1st, 2022, through

April 30th, 2023. There being no discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

Commissioner Holmes moved, seconded by Commissioner Hackworth to approve a resolution to authorize a Funding Agreement with the Lauderdale County Board of Education in connection with construction of a career technical center. The payments of the County under the Funding Agreement shall be limited to twenty consecutive annual installments of two hundred fifty thousand dollars, for a total commitment of five million dollars, to be paid from Simplified Sellers Use Tax (SSUT) disbursements received from the State of Alabama. Chairman Pettus stated that the Commission is glad to help with this project and asks the Board of Education to keep SSUT funding as it currently is so this money will continue to be available to fund this project. There being no further discussion and upon a vote taken, motion unanimously approved. Resolution is herein recorded and made part of these minutes.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A FUNDING AGREEMENT WITH THE LAUDERDALE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION IN CONNECTION WITH CONSTRUCTION OF A CAREER TECHNICAL CENTER

BE IT RESOLVED, ORDERED and DECREED by the Lauderdale County Commission (the "Commission") in the State of Alabama as follows:

Section 1. Findings

The Commission, as the governing body of Lauderdale County, Alabama (the "County"), hereby finds, determines and declares as follows:

- (i) The Lauderdale County Board of Education (the "Board") has undertaken the planning and design of a new Career Technical Center in the County (the "Project");
- (ii) The Project is expected to have a materially positive impact on the County and the surrounding area by furthering educational and future employment opportunities to citizens of the County;
- (iii) The Board expects to utilize a variety of funding sources for the Project, including capital improvement grant funds, debt financing and local government contributions; and
- (iv) Because of the scope and expected cost of the Project, and in recognition of the continued partnership of the County and the Board and the mutual benefits to each to accrue as a result of the Project, the County has determined to provide a limited amount of annual funding to the Board to offset the debt service requirements of the Board in connection with financing of the Project.

Section 2. Authorization of Funding Agreement

- (a) As authorized under the provisions of Section 16-13-309 of the Code of Alabama 1975, as amended, the Commission hereby authorizes and directs execution and delivery by the Chairman of the Commission, on behalf of the County, of a Funding Agreement between the County and the Board for the Project (the "Funding Agreement"), subject to negotiation of mutually satisfactory terms and to the provisions of paragraph (b) below. The Commission further authorizes and directs the County Administrator to impress the seal of the Commission on the Funding Agreement and to attest the same.
- (b) The payments of the County under the Funding Agreement shall be limited to twenty (20) consecutive annual installments of \$250,000, for a total commitment of \$5,000,000. Such annual installments shall be paid in conjunction with the periodic debt service requirements of the Board with respect to the Project and may be payable in such periodic increments as the parties shall determine so long as the total annual commitment of \$250,000 is not exceeded. It is understood by all parties that payment from the County is made from Simplified Sellers Use Tax ("SSUT") Disbursements received from the State of Alabama and this commitment and payment are contingent upon the County's continued receipt of SSUT disbursements from the State of Alabama.

Section 3. Further Actions Authorized

The Commission hereby authorizes the Chairman of the Commission and the County Administrator to take such other actions, and to execute such other agreements, instruments, orders and other documents as shall be necessary to affect the provisions of this resolution.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Lauderdale County Commission that the aforementioned funding agreement with the Lauderdale County Board of Education is approved.
