This is specialized, complex, technical and administrative work in the organization and planning of an Emergency Management program. Work involves the responsibility for developing and maintaining complex, county-wide emergency plans; supporting procedures for operation of the local Emergency Management program in coordination with state and federal agencies and with local groups and organizations; training, instruction and guidance of other response and support agencies; maintaining public information and disaster response and recovery operations in accordance with established plans and procedures. The employee will receive general supervision from the Deputy Director.

- Possess a current Alabama driver's license.
- National Incident Management System (NIMS) Certifications as required by FEMA. \*
